plant	A living thing that uses sunlight to make its own food. Plants grow in the ground or in water.	<div>Plants are living things that grow, usually in the ground. wild	Living naturally, not planted by people.		<div><div>Daisy</div></div> <div><div>Buttercup</div></div>

deciduous	A tree or plant that drops its leaves and then regrows them each year.				
seeds	The tiny parts of a plant that develop into new plants				
fruit	The part of a plant that has seeds such as an apple or strawberry. Most fruits are sweet and can be eaten.				
vegetable	A plant or part of a plant which is used for food, such as carrots, beans, or lettuce.				
underground	Beneath the earth's surface. Carrots and potatoes grow underground.
