

VOCABULARY			Shiny or Dull?		
source	the <i>origin [beginning]</i> of something or where it comes from.		A shiny surface reflects light well. It does not absorb light well.		
absorb	to 'take in' or 'soak up'.		 		
reflect	to 'bounce' light back from a surface.		 		
reflective	a word to describe a surface that reflects or 'bounces' back light.		A dull surface absorbs light well. It does not reflect light well.		
reflection	the image seen when light reflects off a mirror into our eyes.		 		
shadow	a darkened area formed when an object blocks the light shining on it.		 		
opaque	a word to describe a material which lets no light pass through and so is impossible to see through.				
transparent	a word to describe a material which lets all the light pass through and so can be seen through clearly.				
translucent	a word to describe a material which lets some of the light pass through and so can be seen through but not clearly.
