Vocabulary

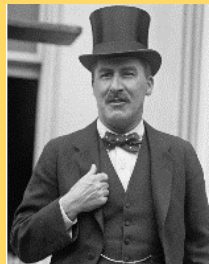
ancient	Belonging to the distant past, in particular to the period in history before the end of the Roman Empire.
River Nile	The longest river in Africa. North flowing through Egypt into the Mediterranean Sea.
civilization	A fully developed society and culture.
kingdom	A country or state ruled by a king or queen.
hieroglyph	A symbol of an object representing a word, syllable, or sound
papyrus	Material prepared from the stem of a water plant, formed into sheets of paper for writing.
cartouche	An oval frame around a design or inscription, often representing a monarch
pyramid	A monumental structure with a square or triangular base with sloping sides that meet in a point. Especially built of stone as a tomb.
pharaoh	The name for an ancient Egyptian ruler.
tomb	A large vault, typically underground, for burying the dead.
mummy	A body of a human being or animal that has been preserved with special treatment and wrapped in bandages.
excavation	remove earth carefully from an area in order to find buried remains.
